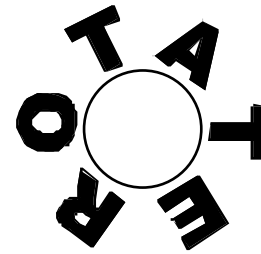


Revolutionary Phrases

The clues below refer to two phrases comprised of the same letters in the same order when written around a circle in clockwise order, but with different starting places. For example, the answers to the clues **turn/consumed decayed matter** would be **rotate/ate rot**. Ignore spaces.



In parentheses are word-length clues. For example, the clue for rotate/ate rot would be (6/3,3). Warning: Many of the expressions are “free-wheeling,” and the cluing style isn’t perfectly consistent. You might want to work with a group to avoid getting too frustrated.

8. Lion-hair burner/Pertinent wrong-doing (4,6/7,3)
9. Not that woman’s heaven-sent bounty/Alternate male (3,3,4/7,3)
10. Lucky steadiness/Measure ahi aptitude (9,9/4,7,3,4)
11. Floral happening/Let off steam or scold (6,5/4,2,5)
12. Intense enthusiasm for brief, real-time internet communiqués/Fedora fanatic (4,5/3,6)
13. What the unused hot tub is put in/Clergyman grows old (3,7/6,4)
14. Web business for Bohemian dance on eating surface/Easy-fitting Pinhead pattern (6,3,5,5/11,5,3)
15. Legume cousin greeting/Obtain competent bee colony (2,9/3,4,4)
16. Shove a citrus peel/Park steward absent from play (3,2,6,4/2,6,2,5)
17. Use up after all others/Total all inmates (7,4,4/3,5,4,3)
18. Behead a diminutive Susan/It scarfed a napped-leather hat (10,1,3/2,3,1,5,3)
19. Meager compassion/Possible slogan those who would eliminate the NEA (5,5/3,3,4)
20. Peg leg end/the female sibling, less professionals (10,8/3,6,5,4)
21. Lid for a kettle/Punch holes in same (6,3,1,6/9,1,3,3)
