After an hour they will all swing to new clover.

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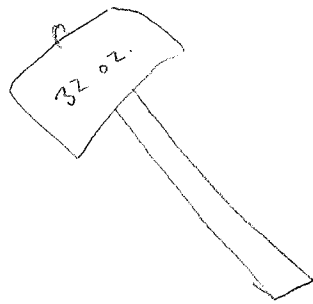
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Gateman sees name, garageman sees name tag.
